CAMPFIRES

When making a campfire please respect the following rules:

- 1. A Burning Permit required from the Bathurst Fire Department.
- 2. For professional organized groups, only one (1) campfire shall be permitted on a property.
- 3. For campgrounds, both private and public, each individual camping lot shall be considered a separate property.
- 4. All campfires shall be contained using a non-combustible material, which shall prevent the accidental spread of fire.
- 5. Campfires shall not exceed 60cm (24 inches) in width and wood not to be piled more than 45 cm (18 inches) in height.
- 6. Clearance of 4.57 meters (15 feet) must be maintained in all directions.
- 7. Only dry seasoned firewood shall be used.
- 8. There shall be no use of treated wood, painted wood, leaves, grass or other vegetation, plastic, oil, rubber or any food materials.
- The fire must be supervised by an adult and all embers must be extinguished with water when burning is completed.
- 10. No burning will take place when the Department of Natural Resources has ban a or restriction on open fires. Please call 1-866-458-8080 or consult their website at:
